



Instructions for access to World Pheasant Association Yahoo Group

When you join the World Pheasant Association Yahoo Group, as well as having access to specific files, photos and links you can choose to receive emails and generate discussion topics with other members of the group. The emails are a great way to stay up to date with current wanted and surplus birds, specific WPA news and research, and anything else that involves Galliformes!

If you are connecting to the group from the link on the Members Area page, please start at point number 4.

Finding the Yahoo Group using the internet

1. Go to www.yahoo.com and click the button 'Groups' in the right hand column 'Yahoo Sites'.

4. Clicking on the link from the Members webpage will bring you to the World Pheasant Association Group Homepage. To join the group click on the blue button in the top right hand corner, 'Join this group'.


5. If you already have a Yahoo account ID and password, enter in your details. If you do not, then click on 'Create New Account'.

7. Fill in your details as requested on the form.



8. Type in the code that you can see in grey. This may be a difficult to read so either press 'audio assistance' button, and it will be read to you or click 'try a new code' and a new code will be generated that maybe clearer to see.

Then click on 'Create my Account'.

11. Step 1: This is your member name, details and alias by which other members will be able to recognise you. If you click on 'Add a new profile', you can adjust the information. It also shows the email address through which you will receive the discussion emails from other members of the group.

Step 2: At this point you can choose to receive an email:

- a. Every time a member emails a discussion topic (Individual email),
- b. Choose to receive a daily email that highlights the discussion topics for the day (Daily digest)
- c. Choose to receive ONLY important notices,
- d. Choose NOT to be notified of discussion topics, and no emails will be sent to you.

Step 2. Message Delivery

- a** **Individual Email**
The option to choose if you want to get each group message and special notice individually and immediately, as it is posted.
- b** **Daily Digest**

- d** **Web Only** - Don't get notified of the latest happenings. Read messages only on the web.

12. To post a new discussion topic, click on 'Post' in the left hand column. This will bring up a page similar to that of an email. Type in the subject of the topic you would like to discuss and then the question, or comment in the box below. Then click on 'Send Message'.

This message/discussion topic will be sent to all members of the group, to which they can then reply.
